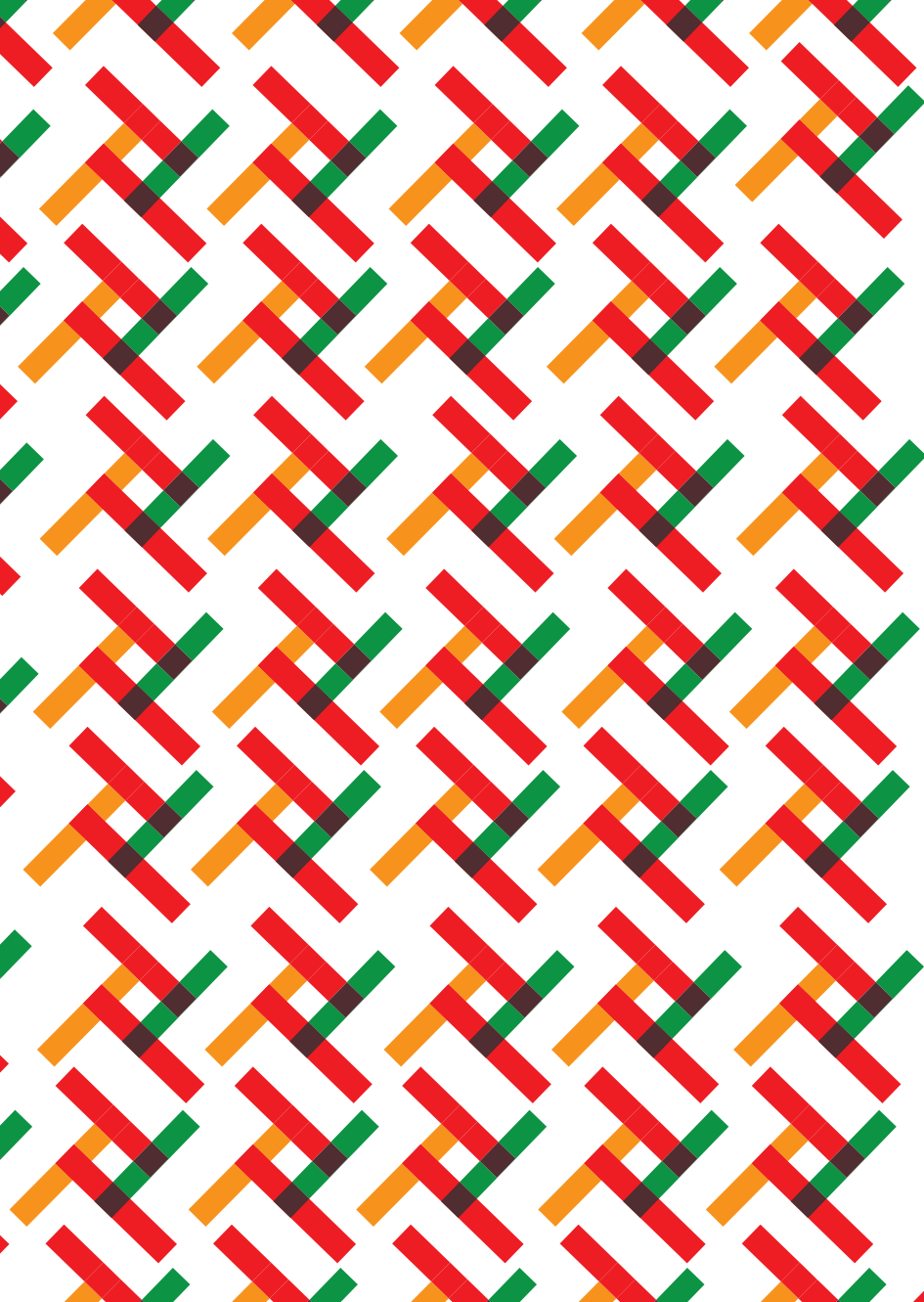

As Premier of the Province of British Columbia, I'm very pleased to welcome everyone to the Canada India Network Society (CINS) 2014 Initiative in Surrey.

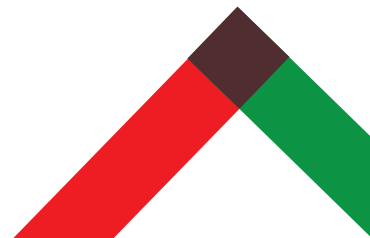
